

In the United States District Court for the District of Puerto Rico, United States of America, Plaintiff vs. THE VESSEL JIRIBILLA No. 21-1067 (FAB). Notice of Order for Interlocutory Sale of Vehicle. Plaintiff, United States of America, has moved this Court, Pursuant to Title 21, United States of Code, Section 853 (e), Title 28, United States Code section 2001 (a) and 2002. Order directing the United States Marshals Service (“USMS”) and or the Drug Enforcement Administration (“DEA”) to execute an interlocutory sale of the following property: One (1) 2007 Sunseeker 82 Foot Vessel, Hull# XSK03586G607. SO ORDERED BY UNITED STATES DISTRICT JUDGE FRANCISCO A. BESOSA Based upon the United States’ motion and for good cause shown, the Court finds that: the interlocutory sale of the vessel, is justified, pursuant to the provisions cited above. The auction will take place online on the website: “[yachtauctions.com](http://yachtauctions.com)” the sale will be on going from the dates 01/24/22 to 01/31/22. An opportunity to view the vessel will be available for 3 days, which are 01/20/22 to 01/22/22 from the hours of: 10:00am to 2PM, at Marina Puerto Del Rey, Km 51.4 State Road #3 Fajardo, PR. The terms, Provisions, and conditions of said order are:

1. The federal agencies and the United States Marshals Service shall obtain an appraisal of the vessel to determine the fair market value. Title 28, United States Code Sections 2001 (a) and 2002 set forth no required terms and conditions of the sale.
2. The sale shall be for cash or a certified or manager’s check.
3. The vessel shall be sold as is and where is to the highest and best bidder; individually, free and clear of all right, title, claims, liens and interest of any and all persons or parties whatsoever existing in the property.
4. At the time of the closing of the sale of the vessel, the US Marshals Service shall pay to any lien holder, if any, the principle and interest amount due on the liens. If the net proceeds of the sale are insufficient to pay the amounts due on the note, this order shall not affect any rights; any lien holders may have to seek a deficiency judgment against the defendant, THE VESSEL JIRIBILLA. No deficiency resulting from a sale pursuant to this order shall be a basis for action or recovery against the United States
5. At the time of the closing of the sale of the vessel, the US Marshals shall deduct from the proceeds of the sale any closing cost and other selling expenses, all costs incurred by the United States relating to the custody and maintenance of the vessel since the time of the seizure through the date of the sale, and the costs to obtain an appraisal of the properties.
6. The net proceeds of the sale shall be deposited according to law by the US Marshals Service and shall be substituted as the vessel in this action. For more information, please contact the US Marshals.
